Scholars such as Li Deshan (李德山) held that the concept of "Joseon" first arose through Gija Joseon (【李德山, 2002】) . In his 1996 book A Study of the Origins of the Northeastern Ancient Peoples and the Dongyi (東北古民族與東夷淵源關係考論, Changchun: Northeast Normal University Press), Li Deshan argued that a "Joseon" entity already existed before Gija Joseon (箕子朝鮮), and that the founder of that ancient Joseon people was Dangun (檀君).

On archaeological and folkloric grounds, the scholar who most actively advances the Dongyi-migration thesis is Li Deshan. He regards the Dongyi (東夷) as a specific designation for the peoples dwelling east of the Huaxia (華夏), thus acknowledging that the Dongyi were distinct from what they call the Han (漢) people. Yet he views the Liaodong Dongyi as migrants from the Shandong (山東) Dongyi, treating the two as different stages of one culture.

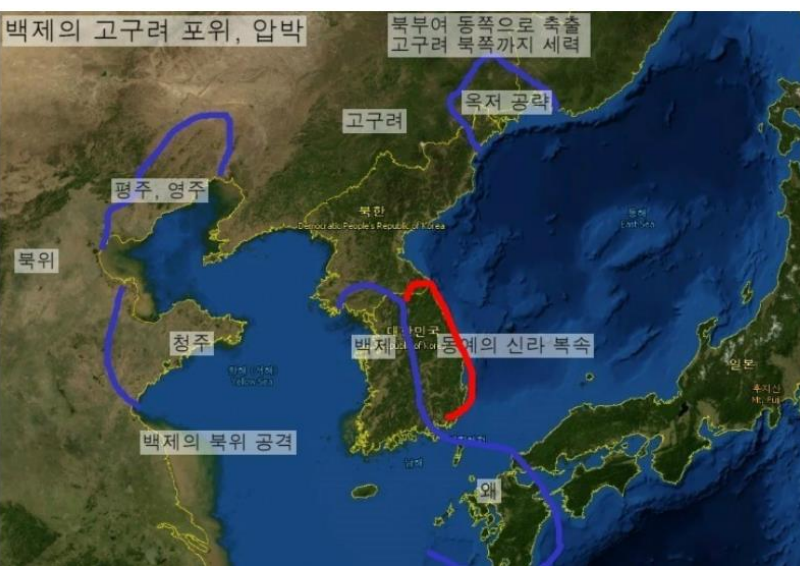
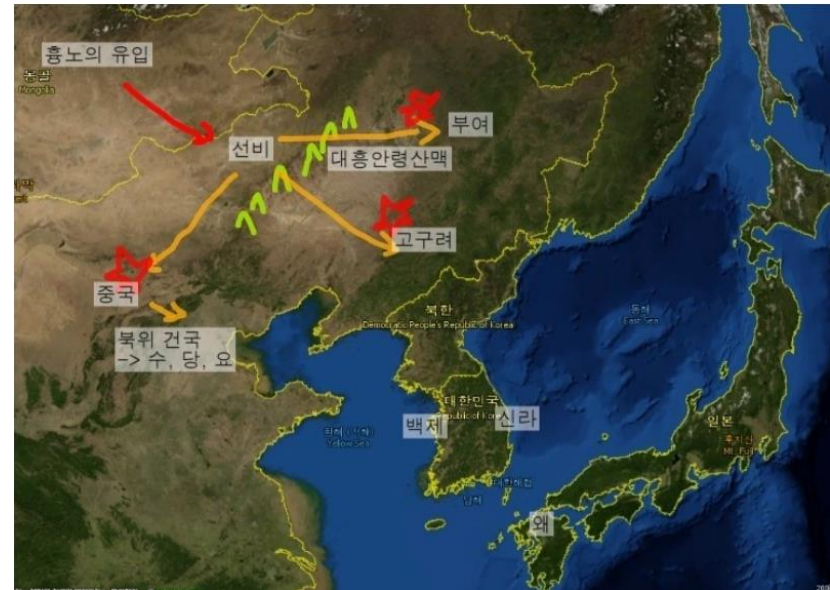
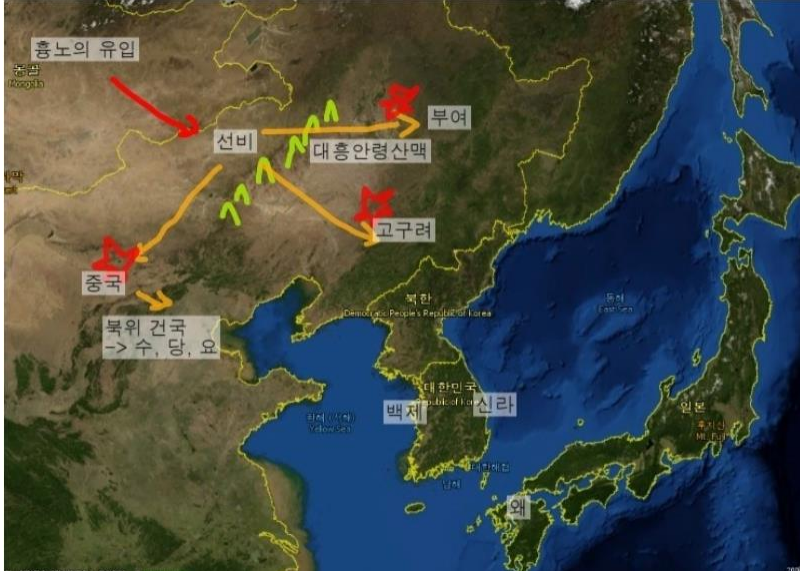

The old text Cefu Yuangui (冊府元龜) gives the surname as Mo (募) and the name as Tae (泰); in the Royal Chronology (As eldest son of King Jijeung; his mother was Lady Yeonje, and his queen was Lady Bodo of the Bak clan.

The Nan Shi (南史), Tongzhi (通志), and Taiping Yulan (太平御覽) all give the surname as Mo (募) and the name as Jin (秦) and the Tongkao (通考), citing the Liang Shu (梁史), gives the same.

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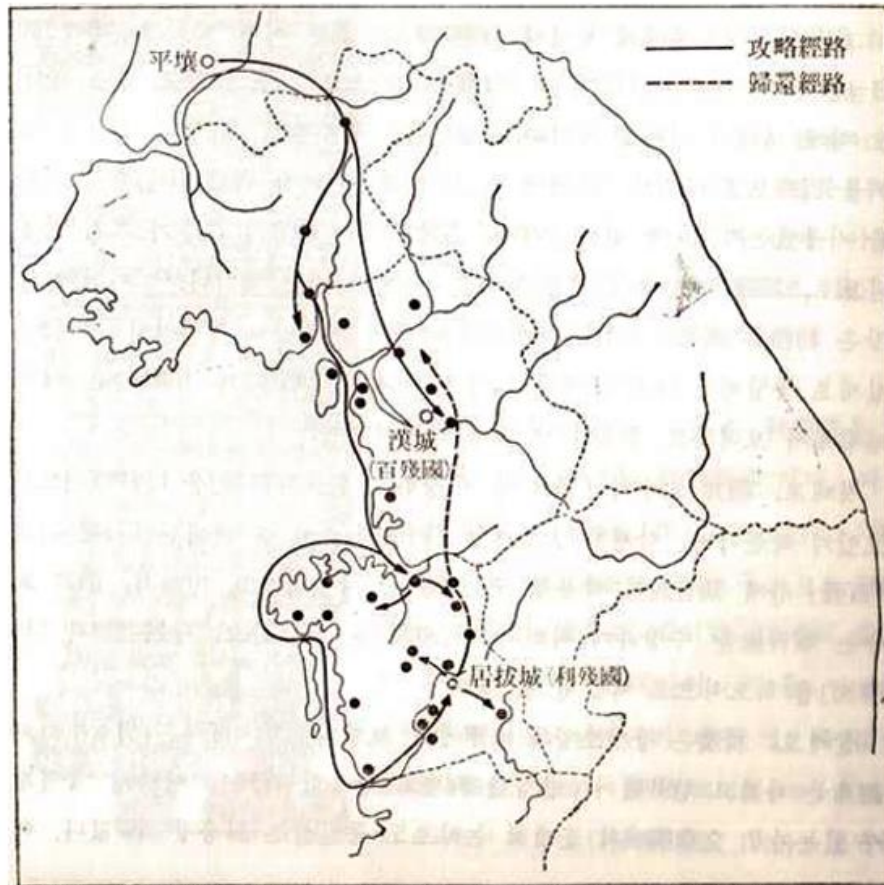

이 낙랑을 흡수한 요서의 선비족 모용씨는 이후 전연(337~370)을 세워 중원을 정복하고, 5세기 중엽(453)부터는 한반도에서 신라, 백제, 왜를 장악하는 역사의 중심 세력으로 떠오른다.(이전 강의 ‘황룡국이 된 신라’ 참조)

이에 비해 백제와 고구려는 시종 자신들이 ‘부여’의 후예임을 강조하여 선비계 사람들과 구분하고 있다. 백제는 비록 5세기 말 선비계 모씨 왕들에 의해 왕권을 빼앗겼지만, 6세기 초 무령왕(여유)은 모씨 성을 쓰지 않고 부여씨 또는 줄여서 여씨를 성을 썼으며,

신라는 부여계 국가인 고구려를 치기 위해 중국을 통일한 선비계 나라인 수나라에 군사적 지원을 요청하는 걸 사표를 짓게 되는데(608년), 수나라의 양제는 그것을 받아들여(611년) 결국 고구려를 공격한다(612년~614년).

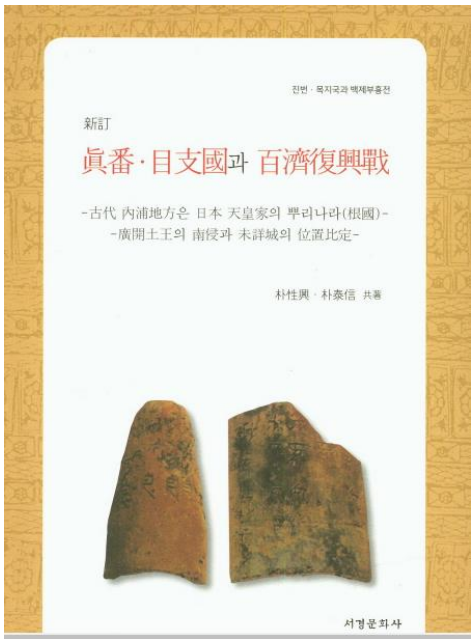

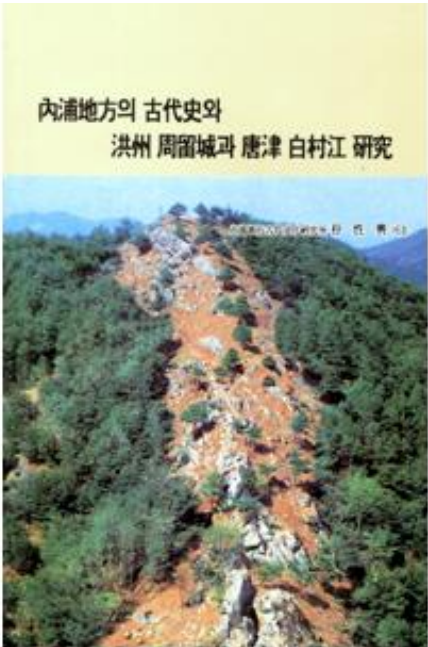

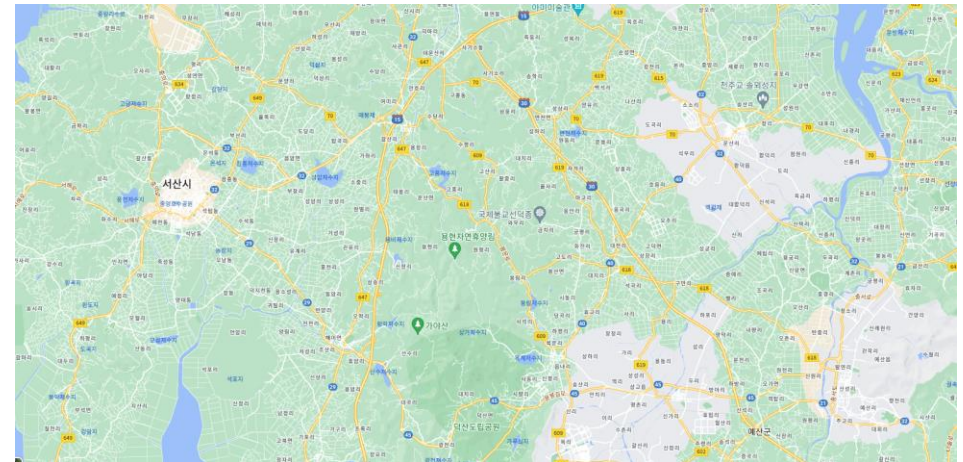

III. Memory before the Battle of Baekchon River and Dangjin

Citing Dr. Yi Hyeon-jong's claim that, since the Jinbeon commandery is a gap in the general histories that cannot be left blank, he adopts Dr. Yi Byeong-do's theory, he raises the hypothesis that the Naepo region may be the old territory of Jinbeon and Mokji, and expounds the 'ancient history of the Naepo region' and 'Hongju Juryuseong' theories.

On Juryuseong, 90 years ago Professor Tsuda of Japan's Waseda University argued for the Hansan theory

Ten years later, 80 years ago, a Japanese scholar who was a historiography officer of the Government-General of Korea argued for the Buan theory. Thereafter,

another decade on, a Japanese professor at Keijo Imperial University argued for the Buan theory,

while Korean historian Yi Byeong-do supported the Hansan theory.

About 15 years ago, Yeongi County local historian Kim Jae-bung argued for Sin Chae-ho's Yeongi theory,

and Park Seong-heung, finding in Kim Jeong-ho's Daedongjiji the line 'Juryuseong is in Hongju,' surveyed the Hongseong County area five times and argued that the fortresses (Hakseong, Seokseong Fortress) around Sanseong-ri, Janggok-myeon were Juryuseong, raising the Hongju theory (Janggok theory).
